

Rep. John Campbell is urging his constituents to share their frustrations with the federal government through a new feature on his website called “It shouldn’t be a law.”

Visitors to Campbell’s website, campbell.house.gov, can fill out a form, reporting laws they view as wasteful, duplicative or just plain don’t agree with.

Campbell’s office already has received a few complaints on laws ranging from the U.S. armed forces’ “Don’t ask, don’t tell” policies and various laws relating to civil court litigation, said Brent Hall, Campbell’s communications director.

“We discussed it with Mr. Campbell and thought it would be great thing for our constituents to get involved,” Hall said. “We started talking about it last year, but wanted to start it in the new year with a new Congress and a fresh start.”

Speaking of fresh starts, Campbell also recently appointed Hall as his new communications director.

Hall was promoted to the position after serving as a legislative assistant in Campbell’s office since 2007.

Campbell also named a new chief of staff this week.

A former legislative director in the personal office of Foreign Affairs Committee Ranking Member Ileana Ros-Lehtinen (R-Florida), Muffy Lewis will oversee Campbell’s Washington, D.C. and the Newport Beach offices.
